Year 3 Galada Community Newsletter Term 1 2019





Reading

We will be exploring:

- Developing interesting characters and settings
- Building an engaging problem
- Creating an exciting ending to solve the problem




Numeracy

This term Galada have been focusing on challenging problems and showing our thinking using a range of different strategies. We have also been working hard on explaining our thinking and understanding that making mistakes help us learn. We have spent a lot of time learning about the importance of having a growth mindset, which means we know we can stretch our brains with effort and practise.

This term we are focusing on:

- Place value
- Problem Solving
- 3D Shapes
- Addition & Subtraction







School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

To start off our Term 1, the Galada team have been revisiting the school values of 'Being Our Best, Being Safe, and Being Respectful'. Students brainstormed how we can show each of our values in different spaces across the school.

We made some wonderful hero posters to display in the Community too!

Galada have also had a large focus on building positive relationships, particularly as we have had many new friends join us for their first year at HHPS.

Students have earned many stickers and badges so far this year, with many more to come!



We are also focusing on Cyber Safety in preparation for using our iPads later this term and throughout the year. Students will gain an understanding of responsible use of technology, ways to be respectful when communicating online, online safety and protecting their privacy online.

As outlined in the ICT agreement that all families have received, iPads are to be used sensibly within class time, brought to school fully charged each day, and only used during class time when instructed by their teachers.

Year 3 Home Learning Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Year 3 participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of home learning per day. Students are expected to read their take home book on a daily basis (or a Just Right Book agreed upon with their teacher) and return it **every** day. Please record the book read each night in their HHPS school diary. **After** reading, families are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the text with their child to develop a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read. Asking students to make some inferences on the text, to accompany our learning focus for the term would also be very beneficial.
