- Building our comprehension skills, Within the text, About the text and Beyond the text questions












Writing:

- Understanding the structure, Orientation, Problem, Series of Events and Solution
- Using punctuation, capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, question marks and talking marks

- Spelling; Prefixes and Suffixes, Multi-syllabic words, unusual Phonics, tricky diagraphs, unstressed vowels.














Home Learning Expectations:


