Week 1-3 – Information report on Animals


Week 4-6 – Information report connected to CBL topic on Renewable Energy


Throughout both topics, students are learning about the following:

- ✓ Digitally publishing a final piece


During the second half of the term, students will be learning about Book Reports. During this unit, students will be learning about the following:

- ✓ Structure of a fiction and non-fiction book report











## Numeracy
