- Continuing to build up stamina during Independent Reading
- Building our comprehension skills, Within the text, About the text and Beyond the text questions
- Our focus for Reading this term is; Inferencing
- Inferencing is when we use story clues and our prior knowledge to discover what is not directly stated in the text. Making inferences help us to understand the text.




This term, students are writing Autobiography recount texts and are learning about the following:

- ✓ Writing in first person
- ✓ Key events of their life and sequencing these in order
- Creating a timeline with photos/artifacts, including captions for these
- Topic sentences, supporting details and connecting paragraphs for events
- ✓ Publishing a final piece using a slide show/video

During the second half of the term, students will be learning about Poetry, they will be focusing on a variety of poems such as:


- ✓ Ode
- ✓ Chinquapin
- ✓ Haiku
- ✓ At the end of the poetry unit students will have the opportunity to choose their own poem to work on and publish
- ✓ Grammar; synonyms, antonyms, time connectives and sensory language, syllables, verbs, adjectives and descriptive language
- Spelling; strategies to work on when writing an unknown word, root words, prefixes, syllabification, multisyllabic words, syntax and diphthongs






Numeracy

Our challenge this term is to present a piece of Australia's history, during CBL students have been looking at the history of Australia and investigating their own family history.


Throughout the term so far students have:
