
1/2 Durrong Community Newsletter





It has been an exciting start to our year in the Durrong Community! We have been very busy investigating our school behaviours of Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best. Our community students have been earning 'Hero Stamps' for showing these behaviours inside the community and 'Hero Cards' when showing these behaviours outside.

This term we are focusing on:

Reading:

Students have been assessed to ascertain their instructional reading level (with satisfactory comprehension) and grouped according to their abilities and point of need. These groups and levels may change throughout the year depending on assessment results and the learning needs of your child.

Your child may be working on one or more of the following skills in their group:

- Picking Just Right books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Establishing our Independent Reading behaviour expectations
- Building up stamina during Independent Reading
- Letter sound recognition
- Blends and diagraphs
- Reading with fluency
- Making connections
- Making predictions and inferences using clues from the text
- Using the text as a tool to assist with answering questions
- Generating questions about the text before, during and after reading

Students have been assessed using initial writing samples and grouped according to their learning needs. Our writing genre this term is Recount. Each writing group may be working on different stages of the writing process (planning, composing, editing, publishing).

Within their groups, students may be focusing on the following skills:

- Placing letters correctly on the lines and putting spaces between words
- Grammar and punctuation
- Vocabulary and sentence structure
- Sound knowledge and spelling


Problem-based Learning (PBL) Handwriting

- Exploring how we learn best Students in the Durrong Community Working on the school value of Cooperation, exploring team work begin most days with a handwriting fluency task. Each week, the focus is
 - Setting personal goals related to learning and teamwork and reflecting on these goals

on forming letters correctly, correct size and orientation of letters and ensuring correct starting position

and pencil control.



Numeracy

Students have been assessed according to their knowledge in relation to counting and place value.

Within planned activities, students may be focusing on the following skills:

- Counting forwards and backwards by 1 from various starting points 0-120, before and after numbers and skip counting by 2,3, 5 and 10
- Patterns investigating and describing number patterns formed by skip counting and with objects
- Place Value recognising numbers, making numbers with icy pole sticks and other materials, writing numbers and ordering numbers from smallest to largest. Students will be working with 2, 3 or 4 digit numbers depending on their assessed skill level

Grade 1/2 Homework Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Grades 1 and 2 participate in a minimum of 20 minutes of homework per day. Students are to read either their take home book or a book on Wushka/Reading Eggs on a daily basis. Please record the book read each night in their yellow home reader book. **After** reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books and give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.

Being a 21st century learning school we have school and home access to some exciting online programs to support the curriculum. In your child's yellow home reader book you will find the login details to the following websites:
