
Term 4, 2020

Welcome back to Term 4! We hope you all had a relaxing break. We are pleased and proud to say that the students have returned to school happy and ready to learn. Students are continuing to display our school behaviours of 'Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best'. The Year 5 students have been given an exciting opportunity to be paired up with a Prep buddy in 2021. Students have been displaying their leadership skills by writing letters to their Year Prep buddies and thinking of the ways they can be a positive role model and support these new students. The Year 5 students have also been preparing themselves for a range of leadership opportunities next year, as we will soon be going through the process of school captain selection.

Remote Learning Reflection

Reading

During term 4, students will be reading a variety of Fiction and Non Fiction books.

We will be focusing on the following areas for Fiction books:

- Organisation and style how a text is organised, how the structure adds to the text and justifying why the text structure works for particular texts
- Analysing how an event/character/setting is described
- Summarising and discussing the main idea/message





We will be focusing on the following areas for Non Fiction books:


Synthesising - explaining what students already know about a topic and identifying what information is new after reading

Summarising- finding what the author wants us to know the most about a topic and using this information to think about how it impacts us in the real world.



Writing

This term our focus will be on expanding our ideas by using descriptive language and using a variety of sentence types. These skills will be a great base for moving into our explanation genre at the second half of the term. During this, we will be looking at topic specific vocabulary, the details of how it works, and the cause and effect. A way you can support your child at home is to start looking at how things work or why something happens, for example 'the life cycle of a frog'.



National Writing Challenge 2020

Some of our students volunteered to participate in the Just Kidding Magazine National Writing Challenge. They worked to craft a personal narrative and shared their creative ideas with their fellow authors. We were so proud to see the students work so hard towards an authentic purpose and take pride in their writing.



Numeracy

During Term 4, students will learn about the following topics:

Number & Algebra - Decimals

Students are learning how to compare, order and represent numbers to the thousandths place.

Measurement & Geometry - Perimeter and Area

Students are learning to calculate the perimeter and area of a rectangle.


Number & Algebra - Patterns and Algebra

Students are learning to create and continue patterns using fractions, decimals and whole numbers

Measurement & Geometry - Chance


Students are learning to predict the probability of something happening.

The students are focusing on building their knowledge in these various curriculum areas.


