LITERACY

This term in Reading the students will be developing in their ability to ask questions before, during and after reading.

How to support your child in building questioning skills:

- What information would you like to find out in this book?
- What does this book make you wonder/question?
- Does this book leave you with any questions? What other information would you now like to find out?
- Where could you find the answer to this question?

In Writing the students are learning how to write a narrative. To support this learning, the children will be exposed to a variety of Fairy tales where they investigate the characters, setting, problem and solution. In the next couple of weeks your child will begin creating their own narrative using inspiration from the texts they have read. Be sure to ask your child about their character, setting, problem and solution! Stay tuned!

This term we are exploring what a good friend does, how to use the wheel of choice and learning to work as part of a team. Our students are now very familiar with the Wheel of Choice and we



CHALLENGE BASE LEARNING (CBL)

This term our Big Idea is **Change**. The Prep students focus for this is how things change from farm to plate, e.g. milk is used to make butter, ice cream and yoghurt. We have been busy learning about the different sorts of animals you would find on a farm and even had a







ORAL LANGUAGE

Oral language will be developed during Challenge Based Learning this term. The children will be participating in a range of language experiences including craft (making animals), making butter from cream, making pillows out of feathers and a visit to Coles. During this time, our students will learn new vocabulary and have the opportunity to write about their experiences.



NUMERACY

Subtraction-Students have been learning to count back, use number lines and concrete materials such as counters and blocks, to solve simple subtraction stories, e.g. Breanna had 9 apples but she dropped 2 on the floor. How many does she have left?

Sharing-Students will be involved in modelling situations with sharing, e.g. Sarah has 6 cakes to share with Jacinta and Malinda. How many do they each get?

Shape-Students will explore both 2D and 3D shapes. They will look at shapes in the environment and sort and classify shapes based on their attributes, e.g. a rectangle and a square both have four sides.
