


EVENTS & REMINDERS

It has been wonderful getting to know the range of reading interests among our students through our Reading Start Up program. Students and teachers have worked together to establish shared expectations for reading in Year 6 to set us up for a successful year.

The Maramba community will be focusing on the following topics this term:

- Building stamina during independent reading
- Building our comprehension skills going deeper about and beyond the text
- Setting purposeful, individual reading goals to develop our skills to comprehend a variety of texts



Reading Challenge



Commencing this term, the Maramba community will be tracking our home reading nights. A reading nights wall has been set up in the community to share the celebration of students showing kaizen by reading each night at home. It is expected that students are reading at home for 30 minutes every night. Home reading is critical to each student's reading progress and is a great way to share individual interests at home.

WRITING /

Throughout Term 1 our focus will be based around the skills of Narrative. We will be unpacking what it takes to write a great narrative and set our learners up for success. We will be using the '6+ 1 Traits' to support our development of these skills. We look forward to sharing some of our fantastic stories that the learner creates.

A way you can support at home with this is encouraging your child to read different Narrative's and write their own version of the stories. Writing mileage is a massive support and will build their stamina which is important for writing in Year 6.



NUMERACY



The learners are in the full swing of things with Numeracy and have settled into their groups. So far in Numeracy we have been focusing on Place Value. Specifically looking at expanding and renaming numbers up to hundreds of thousands.

On a Monday, students will be presented with a challenging question. This will allow students to be exposed to the concept that they will be working towards each week. Students have enjoyed challenging questions about Place Value and shape so far.

We also encourage the students to be using the online subscriptions, Mathletics and My Numeracy on Essential Assessment, to get a head start on some of these topics. The key for preparing for upcoming topics is about exposure to the type of questions and identifying the vocabulary of the topic. This will support your child with feeling confident in Numeracy.



Number & Algebra - Place Value

Identify and describe prime, multiples, factors, composite, square and triangular numbers. Investigate everyday situations that use integers. Locate and represent these numbers on a number line.

Measurement & Geometry - 3D Shape


Construct prisms & pyramids. Connect 3D objects with their nets and other 2D representations.

Number & Algebra - Operations

Mental and written strategies to solve problems involving all four operations with whole numbers.

Home Learning Expectations

It is recommended that students in Year 6 participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of homework per day. Students are expected to read their take home book on a daily basis (or a Just Right Book agreed upon with their teacher) and return it every day. Please record the book read each night in their School diary. After reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the text with their child to develop a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.
