READING




'TODAY A READER, TOMORROW A LEADER'

- name the features and structures of a text and explain it's impact.
- recognise new information and explain how our thinking has changed.
- infer deeper meaning of characters and their actions.
- recognise authors styles and traits to interest the reader.





In Term 1 students developed their Narrative writing skills and completed the writing process to publish 2 narratives for a different audiences. Students presented one completed text to their Prep buddies and one for the Year 5 students as a Google Site.





In Term 2 students will be exploring the text type of persuasive writing. Students will be immersed in a range of persuasive texts including advertising and debates to develop their use of persuasive language devices in a range of contexts.

Writing skills we will be focusing on are:

- persuasive language devices
- paragraphing
- supporting statements and evidence




NUMERACY

It was great seeing the determination and problem-solving that was developed and shown last term. Term 2 has started off in the same fashion. We have been looking at time and making the learning real by unpacking reading the Melbourne City Train and Bus timetables to support or numeracy learning.

This term we are talking a lot about the learning disposition of Determined and Reflect in Numeracy. This will support the students to think about their next steps in numeracy and push themselves to achieve their goals. Ways that you can support at home with this is practicing counting goals and talking about the upcoming topics such as fractions.

They solve problems using the addition and subtraction of related fractions.


Measurement & Geometry Angles


Investigate angles on a straight line, angles at a point and vertically opposite angles and use results to find unknown angles






This term in Challenge Based Learning, our essential question is:



Here is some of what they said:


