
**EVENTS & REMINDERS**

## READING

'TODAY A READER, TOMORROW A LEADER'

In Term 4 we had a combined term of remote and onsite reading. We finished the year by looking at both fiction and non fiction texts, with the focus on the following goals:

### **Fiction:**

- Summarising
- Inferring
- Writer's Craft
- The Message
- Authors Choice

### **Non Fiction:**

- Main Idea and Supporting Details
- Authors Purpose
- Synthesising
- Language Choice
- Author's Point of View

It is important that students are completing Independent Reading at home for 30 minutes each day. We encourage students to discuss their individual reading goal with a family member at home so they can talk about the strategies they are using and share their success.



We celebrate Independent Reading through a Reading Night's Wall display. Here, students can track how many nights they have read and it is displayed right here in our community.

## WRITING

'WORDS HAVE POWER'

In Term 4 we had a combined term of remote and onsite writing. Over the last few weeks we have been reflecting upon our school life to write an entry for our year book. Students have had the opportunity to be creative with their entry. Some students have written poems, autobiographies and even songs to reflect their seven years of primary school. Each student's page will be published in the 2021 Yearbook.





## **NUMERACY**

#### 'MISTAKES ALLOW THINKING TO HAPPEN'

It's been a great term of Numeracy. The students have been extending their knowledge in a broad range of topics using their problem solving skills.

If the students would like to revisit the topics we have covered this term then they can access My Numeracy on Essential Assessment to work through their misconceptions and practice further.

If you would like to get a head start on these for home learning then there are plenty of activities on Mathletics which students can access. Problem Solving and Reasoning is a big part of numeracy and we focus on this every week during challenge Monday. This is a way for students to use their prior knowledge to think critically about a problem.

### Term 4 topics

#### **Statistics and Probability - Data**

Construct, interpret and compare a range of data displays. Including side by side column graphs for two categorical variables.

#### **Number & Algebra - Four Operations - Decimals**

Adding and subtracting decimals. Multiply decimals by whole numbers. Division by non-zero whole numbers where the results are terminating decimals.

Multiply and divide decimals by powers of 10. Create sequences involving whole numbers. Fractions and decimals

#### **Number and Algebra - Money**

Investigate and calculate percentage discounts. 10%, 25% & 50%.

#### **Measurement & Geometry - Length, Mass & Capacity**

Connect decimals to the metric system and convert between common formal units. (mass & capacity)




