READING


During Term 4 students will be consolidating their learning on various areas including identifying the author's message and how this links to the overall theme of the text.

We have been focusing on encouraging students to think deeply about the texts they are reading, form their own opinions based on the ideas within their texts and discuss and share these opinions with others.

We have begun this term with some thematic studies, where we have read multiple texts based on the same theme. E.g. Stolen Generations, Natural Disasters and War. This has been the perfect platform in which students have been able to form and share their opinions with others.







WRITING

This term in Writing students will be engaging in two different writing genres; explanation texts and poetry!

EXPLANATION TEXTS


A five paragraph written piece that explains how or why something happens or occurs. E.g. Why can't we live on Saturn?

Students will attend an excursion to CERES which will support their understanding of waterways and using this knowledge, they will have the opportunity to write an explanation text on this topic.


<u>POETRY</u>

Literary work in which the expression of feelings and ideas are given, by the use of a distinctive style and rhythm. The types of poetry Year 5 students will be learning about and creating include Ode, Cinquain and Haiku.









NUMERACY

Numeracy learning in Term 4 began with a week on 3D shape. We explored 3D shapes and their nets, in particular all of the 2D shapes included in a net which construct a 3D object. The students had so much fun and experienced success constructing 3D shapes while using hands on resources.

Other topics we are exploring this term include volume and capacity, decimals, creating patterns with fractions, decimals and whole numbers, data and angles.

This term's at Home Learning Module is now on Google Classroom. By competing it, students will have the opportunity to consolidate their skills in a number of different areas covered throughout the year. A Certificate will be provided to students once they have completed and submitted the module.



PERSONAL & SOCIAL LEARNING

This Term, Year 5 students are continuing a block of sessions focussed on Growth and Development including puberty. Throughout these sessions, the following topics will be explored:

- Choice and consent considering the long–term consequences of choices
- Peer pressure empowering students to make choices for themselves and speak up

Later this term, we will explore Topic 8 of the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships learning resource. The main themes explored in Topic 8 – Positive Gender Relations are:

- Relationships Impact of actions on others.
- Safety What is violence? What are the different types of violence? How to promote safety, rights & respect in relationships.
- Respect How to show respect, actions & skills for respectful relationships.
- Peer support & help-seeking Skills & resources for peer support & help-seeking



BIG DEA! Geography



ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS:

- × How do places, people and cultures differ across the world?
- * How do people and environments influence one another?

Each week students will work through the CBL Inquiry Stages of Engage, Investigate and Act, where they will investigate geographical diversity and make connections between people and places.

Students will also have the opportunity to discover aspects of the following continents Asia, Europe and North America. They will compare the technology, natural disasters, forest population, culture and spoken languages with Australia.
