----Curriculum Report----

It has been a busy start to the Term as our staff and students settle into their Learning Communities and get to know one another. In the initial weeks each Learning Community has been focusing on *'Learning to Learn'*, they have been developing expectations on how they will work in their Learning Community, utilising the different spaces and furniture as they begin to understand how they learn best.

Teachers have been busily assessing students in areas of Literacy and Numeracy to find out their strengths and needs. They will use the data collected to create flexible groups within their Learning Communities.

The students have begun their specialist classes, having Science with Joel and Physical Education with Andrew.







Take Home Reading Program

The HHPS Take Home Reading Program will begin shortly. As an inaugural student at HHPS, your child will be provided with a HHPS Reading Satchel. Students will either borrow books from set boxes or access eBooks through their Wushka account. It is expected that reading is occurring nightly and the books read are recorded in their home reading log book. The books your child will bring home/access on Wushka are intended to be easier than the levels they are reading at school, as it is a time for them to practice learnt reading strategies and build their fluency.



Next week our whole school will be focussing on Being Safe. These expectations will be taught in the communities and reinforced during all interactions throughout the school week.

SCHOOL TIMES School begins at 8:50am. Please ensure you arrive to school with plenty of time for your child/ren to calmly enter their Learning Community. School Gates are opened at 8:30am and Staff are on duty from 8:40am. If late, parents must sign their students in at the office. The school day ends at 3:10pm.

UNIFORMS Please ensure all items of uniform are clearly labelled. A lost property tub can be found in the Community Hub (room next to the Canteen) where unnamed items found in the school yard are kept.

SICK BAY Parents are reminded that if your child needs to be medicated during the school day, you will need to bring the medication to the Office in the morning and complete a form giving us permission to medicate your child. At the end of the day the medication must be collected by an adult and signed out.

SCHOOL CROSSING Parents, as a school community, we are asking you to please set the right example and use the crossing points when crossing the streets around our school. The safety of our parents and children is of paramount importance.

SCHOOL CAR PARK Parents, as a reminder please be aware that the staff car park is for **staff vehicles only**.

Please note that NO pedestrians are allowed to walk through the staff car park at anytime, for safety reasons. We have staff cars coming and going on a regular basis and we want to avoid any accidental injuries to our school community.

COURT ORDERS If you have any court orders relevant to your child could you please provide the school with a copy, to ensure their safety while in the school's care.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION Is all the general and emergency information you have given the school up to date? If not could you please notify the Office ASAP. This information is very important in case we need to contact you at any time.

PREP 2018 Enrolments for Prep next year will be taken in 2nd term. Please come to the office at the end of April /early May to collect an enrolment form.

PHOTO DAY Our school photos will be taken on Friday, 21st April. More information to follow.

CSEF (Camp, Sport and Excursion Fund) Parents who hold a current Centrelink Pensioner concession or Health Care benefit card or a Veteran Affairs pension card are required to come to the Office to apply for CSEF. Please bring your concession card with you. The CSEF payments will be processed directly to schools with the majority of payments to commence from March, 2017.
