
Term 2, 2019

Term 2 has so far been an exciting time for the Dulap Community. We are continuing to investigate the expected school behaviours of Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best. It is amazing how many 'Hero points' students have received in Term one and how many badges students are now accumulating. We have also been revisiting our school values and principles, and what they look like in Year 5.











This Term we are focusing on:

Reading:

- Continuing to pick *Just Right* books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Continuing to build up stamina during Independent Reading
- Our focus for Reading this term is Summarising.

Summarising for Fiction texts:

Identifying the orientation (characters and setting), event 1 - problem, event 2 - solution and the conclusion

Summarising for Non Fiction texts:

Identifying the 'Big Idea', 3 supporting details that go with the main idea and then writing a four sentence summary

 Building our comprehension skills, Within the text, About the text and Beyond the text questions







Writing:

This term, students are writing *Persuasive texts* and learning about the following:

- Writing letters and being part of debates
- Learning about the structure of a Persuasive text,
 Opinion, Reason and an example, Reason and an example, Reason and an example and restating your opinion
- Learning the difference between a fact and opinion
- Learning Persuasive Devices such as persuasive language, emotive language, rhetorical questions, researching, finding evidence, paraphrasing, connectives, paragraphing and leading in sentences.
- Immersion, socratic circles, structure of debates, rebuttals against a point of view, using visuals to help present an opinion




- Grammar; Pronouns, prefixes, apostrophes, conjunctions, commas and emotive language
- Spelling; 's' making different sounds, end sound, 'ant' and 'ent', 'ary' end sound, 'tion' end sound, the 'un' sound, 'ch' making the 'c' sound, 'ea', 'an' and the 'en' sound.





Numeracy:

- Number and Algebra- Fractions, Money, Location
 - Measurement and Geometry- Time





Challenge Based Learning (CBL):

Our 'challenge' this Term is to create healthy communities, during CBL students have been looking at different ways to promote physical, mental, social and emotional health to others.

To do this, students have had to learn about all these different aspects of health, so far students have:

- Participated in dance and exercise classes
- Studied the nutritional value of various food labels
- Participated in 'Junior Masterchef', where they had to create their own plate of healthy foods using fruits and vegetables
- Taken part in a meditation lesson



Students have now begun brainstorming ideas of how they can create a healthier community. They will then choose an area they would like to focus on and begin planning and implementing a solution.

Some of the ideas students have come up with are:

- Yoga class
- Fitness club
- Creating a podcast
- Painting class
