for showing our expected school behaviours of Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best.


This term we are focusing on:

Reading:

- Picking Just Right books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Building up stamina during Independent Reading
- Book genres
- Text Features
- Vocabulary development
- Comprehension Strategies:
 - Predicting
 - Summarising
 - Reading with expression
 - Inferring

Writing:

- Text types- Persuasive
- Handwriting- correct formation and joining of some letters
- Correct spelling and usage of grammar such as 'a' and 'an'
- Punctuation focus groups i.e. full stops, capital letters, quotation marks and commas
- Writing Process identifying the different stages of writing, e.g. planning, drafting, revising and editing, conferencing and publishing.



Numeracy

- Counting Patterns- Describe, continue and create addition and subtraction patterns.
- Shape Explain and compare the properties of 2D shapes and 3D object and making models of 3D objects and describing their features. We will also be comparing the areas of regular and irregular shapes by informal means e.g. counting boxes and comparing & describing 2D shapes that result from combining and splitting common shapes.



Grade 3/4 Homework Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Grades 3 and 4 are continuing to participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of homework per day. Students are to continue to read their take home book on a daily basis and return it **every** day. All students are given an opportunity to change their take home book daily and it is **their** responsibility to ensure this is done. Please continue to record the book read each night in their green home reader log book. **After** reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books to give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.
