This term we are focusing on:

Reading:

- Picking Just Right books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Building up stamina during Independent Reading
- Book genres
- **Text Features**
- Vocabulary development
- Comprehension Strategies:
 - Predicting
 - Summarising
 - Reading with expression
 - Inferring

Writing:

- Text type- Narrative texts
- Handwriting- correct formation, diagonal and horizontal joins
- Correct spelling and usage of grammar such as 'a' and 'an'
- Spelling focus groups
- Writing Process identifying the different stages of writing, e.g. planning, drafting, revising and editing, conferencing and publishing.

Numeracy

- Place Value
 - Recognise, model, represent and order numbers
 - Partition, rearrange and regroup numbers.
 - Investigate and use the properties of odd & even numbers
- Time
 - Time to the minute.
 - Investigate the relationship between units of time.
 - Converting between units of time.
 - Using AM & PM to solve simple time problems.









• Grade 3/4 Homework Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Grades 3 and 4 are continuing to participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of homework per day. Students are to continue to read their take home book on a daily basis and return it **every** day. All students are given an opportunity to change their take home book daily and it is **their** responsibility to ensure this is done. Please continue to record the book read each night in their green home reader log book. **After** reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books to give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.
