


Galada Term 3 Community Newsletter


Welcome back to another exciting and eventful term in Year 1 at Harvest Home Primary School. We have had a fantastic start to term 3 and we are looking forward to many exciting things to come! This term the students have continued to work on their learning goals and are enjoying new challenges in all areas of their learning. Reading

This term, students will be working on various aspects of reading, such as:

- · Word work including identifying nouns, verbs and adjectives in a text
- Exploring different genres of texts, e.g. Fairy Tales, Fiction, Non-Fiction
- Identifying features of a Fiction text, e.g. character, setting, problem and solution
- Identifying features and explaining the purpose of a Non-Fiction text, e.g. headings, contents, glossary, index
- Continuing to develop a range of comprehension skills, such as summarising, inferencing, synthesising and analysing texts.













Writing

This term we are focusing on writing narratives. So far, we have been exploring traditional fairy tales to further students' knowledge of the features of a narrative. Our aim is for students to create and publish their own narrative.


Students will be following the writing process of planning, drafting, editing and publishing their narratives, which will include characters, settings, a problem and solution.

Within their groups, students will be continuing to work on the following skills:

- Using consistent boundary punctuation such as capital letters and full stops.
- Adding detail to their writing using adjectives and adverbs.
- Rereading and editing their work for grammar and spelling.
- Using the dotted thirds to help with letter formation.
- Using their phonics and OWL word knowledge to spell tricky words.









Phonics / Spelling

Each week students have sessions dedicated to Phonics based on the needs of the students. Within the Phonics sessions students develop their phonological and phonemic awareness. Jolly Phonics is used within the communities to identify, segment and blend sounds. As students continue to develop their knowledge of letter sounds, they are introduced to alternative spellings for some common sounds, e.g. the 'ay' in 'play' making /ai/.

In Grammar students are learning about different kinds of words and how they work together to form a sentence that makes sense. This supports them to understand the books they are reading and when writing their own texts. Some common words they are learning about include the following: nouns, adjectives,

verbs, pronouns, and adverbs.



Numeracy

In Term 3, we are continuing to use our 5 OK's to develop our problem solving skills and challenge our thinking. Students' number fluency will continue to be supported through their individual Counting Goals.

This term we are learning about place value, money, chance and data, time and length. In these topics we will be focusing on:

Place Value:

- Recognise, make, read, write and order numbers to at least 100
- Locate these numbers on a number line
- Identify ten more and ten less

Money:

Recognise, describe and order Australian coins according to their value

Chance and Data:

- The language of chance, e.g. will happen, might happen and won't happen
- Choose simple questions and gather responses and represent the data that students have gathered

Time:

Describe duration of time, e.g. months, weeks, day and hours


Length:

· Use informal units of measurement, e.g. blocks and pencils to order objects based on length



















Personal and Social Learning


In our Personal and Social lessons each week, Year 1 students will continue to explore Respectful Relationships through "help seeking" activities, working collaboratively with a range of students and discussing aspects of friendship. Later in the term, students will be learning how to keep their bodies safe. The program Bravehearts provides an interactive and entertaining way to teach students how to keep both their bodies and feelings safe from others. Some of the things the students will be learning include; yes and no feelings, warning signs and secrets to tell adults.




Challenge Based Learning (CBL)

In CBL, Year 1 students will be exploring the theme of "power" in relation to making good choices. They will be investigating how they are responsible for making their own good choices and how their choices can affect others around them. Throughout the term, students will be creating a 'superhero' character that fixes a common problem.















Tutor Learning Initiative

Throughout Term 3 and Term 4, Josie and Fraser will be working with students in small groups to improve their Reading, Writing and Numeracy skills. Josie and Fraser will also be working with a selection of students in the LLI (Levelled Literacy Intervention) program. This program is used to build reading skills such as comprehension, fluency, and vocabulary. Students will be working in a small group three times a week, in addition to their regular Literacy sessions.

Year 1 Home Learning

In Year 1, Home Learning will continue to consist of Take Home reading, Tricky OWL word lists for students to practise reading and a number chart for students to practise their counting goal.

It is recommended that students in Year 1 participate in a minimum of 20 minutes of home learning per day with a family member. Students are to read either their take home book or a book on Reading Eggs or Sunshine Online on a daily basis. Please record the book read each night in their yellow home reader book. After reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books and give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.





Reading

This term, students will be working on various aspects of reading, such as:

- Word work including identifying nouns, verbs and adjectives in a text
- Exploring different genres of texts, e.g. fairy tales, Fiction,
 Non-Fiction
- Identifying features of a Fiction text, e.g. character, setting, problem and solution •Identifying features and explaining the purpose of a Non-Fiction text, e.g. headings, contents, glossary, index
- Continuing to develop a range of comprehension skills, such as summarising, inferencing, synthesising and analysing texts





Phonics/Grammar

Each week students have sessions dedicated to Phonics based on the needs of the students. Within the Phonics sessions students develop their phonological and phonemic awareness. Jolly Phonics is used within the communities to identify, segment and blend sounds. As students continue to develop their knowledge of letter sounds, they are introduced to alternative spellings for some common sounds, e.g. the 'ay' in 'play' making /ai/.

In Grammar students are learning about different kinds of words and how they work together to form a sentence that makes sense. This supports them to understand the books they are reading and when writing their own texts. Some common words they are learning about include the following: nouns, adjectives, verbs, pronouns, and adverbs.






Writing


