

Tamboore Community Newsletter

Term 3

Students have made an excellent start to term 3. They have transitioned to their Literacy and Numeracy groups each day with big smiles on their faces prepared with the appropriate materials to begin each lesson.

Writing

In Writing this term we have introduced procedural texts to students and have worked through a range of learning experiences. Students made playdough, created a paper bag monster and participated in games such as silent ball. Afterwards students wrote a list of materials required for each experience and a set of instructions about how to create or play each of these.

Students have been using these experiences to plan, draft, revise and edit procedural texts of their own. In each of the procedural texts written we have been writing, students have included a title, materials and/or ingredients and the step-by-step instructions. They have utilised adverbs to enhance their writing and included verbs to help their audience understand each step.

Following procedural texts students will be writing information reports about animals. They will research a chosen animal and then write an information report including facts about the animals' appearance, habitat and diet. Information reports will be planned, drafted, revised and edited before being published. For the remainder of this term, we will continue to build on our knowledge of different topics and improve the quality of our writing through using topic specific vocabulary and sub-headings. We will also be learning to use captions and create diagrams through labelling important parts.

















Reading

This term, students will be developing their thinking and skills in Reading by focusing on the following areas:

- continuing to build their reading stamina by taking part in Independent Reading everyday
- understanding information included in non-fiction texts
- identifying new information and making connections to ideas in nonfiction texts
 - discussing new information and how their thinking has changed about different topics
- analysing different non-fiction features and how texts are structured

Students have been recording their daily Independent Reading using their Reading Log. They can record their reading at school just like they do at home to celebrate their reading growth.

Things you can do at home

We are continuing to celebrate 'Nights of Reading' every week. Please support your child to record their home reading daily in their Yellow Reading Journals.

Remember you can record the following texts:

- take home books
- online books from Sunshine Online and Reading Eggs
 - personal books

It is important that your child reads for 20-30 minutes every day to develop their love of reading. You can help by having discussions about the texts they read and ask comprehension questions found in their Take Home Learning folder as a guide to further help them to grow as thinking readers.







Numeracy

In Numeracy this term, we will be continuing to practise our problemsolving skills through regular opportunities to complete challenge tasks. We have been exploring the connection between addition and subtraction, focusing on fact families where we use three numbers to create different number sentences.

In our Numeracy lessons, we have been discussing the purpose of different symbols (+ - =) and practising to use these in different ways. Students have also been solving worded addition and subtraction problems to find a missing part.

Following on from this topic, we will be focusing on 3-Dimensional shapes and their properties. Students will learn about the faces, vertices and edges of different objects and how they compare to 2-Dimensional shapes.

For the remainder of term, students will be exploring the following topics

- Money: counting and ordering coins and notes
 - Time: calendars and seasons
 - Mass: comparing the mass of objects









Personal and Social Learning (SWPBS)

This term in Personal and Social Learning students will be focusing on the schools' positive behaviours of Being Our Best, Being Respectful and Being Safe. Students will be working through two different modules which will help them to develop their problem-solving skills and understand how to keep their bodies safe. Students will also be celebrating national focuses such as Father's Day and R U OK? Day.







Challenge Based Learning (CBL)

During CBL our big idea is Power, students will be thinking about how their actions can shape who they are. They will explore the idea of how their voice can impact their choice. As part of this learning, students will be identifying the difference between right and wrong choices, and how the choices they make can affect a given outcome. Students will explore the right choices they can make in everyday life scenarios through role plays and creating narratives.

READING


In Term 3, students will be developing their thinking and skills in Reading by focusing on the following areas

NUMERACY




