

This term we are focusing on:

### **Reading:**

- Increasing our reading stamina during Independent Reading
- Ensuring students are aware of, are practising and are recording evidence of their personal reading goals using their goal template

Our overarching comprehension focus is <u>analysing and critiquing</u>. We have been exploring how the author builds suspense in fiction texts and the organisational structures of non-fiction texts, such as characteristics which reflect the genre. Students have also been completing book reviews and justifying their opinions using evidence from the text.



### Writing:

• Text type – Reports

This term we are working towards writing reports. We will be exploring:

- The features of newspaper articles, magazines, news reports and annotated diagrams
- How to plan, prepare and present an interview using open-ended questions
- What makes a title engaging or eye-catching for the reader
- The writing process and what it looks like when writing reports




#### **Numeracy:**

In Term 4, these are the main topics of focus with some examples:

- Symmetry and angles comparing angles and creating symmetrical patterns
- Data constructing data displays such as column graphs and picture graphs using collected data
- Fractions and decimals recognising place value system up to tenths and hundredths and forming connections between fractions and decimal notation
- Volume comparing objects using familiar metric units of area and volume

We are continuing with our weekly 'challenging tasks' allowing students to develop their deep thinking, problem solving strategies and reasoning skills.



## As part of our School-Wide Positive Behaviour sessions, we are continuing to reinforce our school values and behaviours. In the Balam Learning Community as well as across the school, we are always looking to demonstrate Kaizen and Be Our Best, Safe and Respectful.




We will also be looking at important social skills concepts such as how to ask for help and understand social and physical development.

### Challenge Based Learning (CBL)

Our focus this term is DESIGN! Students have been learning about water, considering the impact of drought as water is a precious resource for survival. Water wastage has been explored, identifying the need for effective designs to prevent this. Students have engaged in various design-related activities such as locating designs which store, collect or provide water within the school, completing a water audit at home and timing how long it takes to fill a litre bottle using the taps at school.











### **Learning with a Twist**

Some of our students have had the opportunity to work with our Learning Specialist, Dale. Dale has been taking some additional guided reading groups, working with our students to improve comprehension and discussions about texts. Dale has also been running some small group learning activities based on 'Minute to Win it', making learning exciting and engaging for our students. We are lucky to have Dale's presence in our community!
