Welcome to Term 1 in the Yiaga Community. This year the Yiaga teaching team includes Alex Kennedy, Taylah Hancock and Jae Dickinson. We are all very eager and excited to work with the wonderful Year 6 students in our community.

To help set up the Community and learn how to work collaboratively, the students have been investigating the expected school behaviours of Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best. In our community, students have been earning 'Hero points' for showing these behaviours. We have also been revisiting our school values and principles and what they look like in Year 6.

It has been great to hear the level of engagement students have had towards their reading throughout the community at the start of the year. Many students are bringing reading material that they love from home which is outstanding.

The Yiaga community have been focusing on the following topics in reading over the first term of 2020:

- Picking Just Right books and using the 5 Finger Rule
- Building up stamina during Independent Reading
- Building our comprehension skills
  - Within the text, About the text and Beyond the text
- Understanding the expectations of a reading classroom
- How to track our thinking using a Reader's Notebook
- Developing our reading goals
- Setting up and organising our classroom libraries







Reading Challenge

Commencing Week 4 of Term 1, the Yiaga community is hosting a home reading competition to see which students in the community have read at home the most amount of nights. A 'Reader Leaderboard' has been set up in the community to track the amount of nights each student is reading. It is expected that students are reading at home for 30 minutes every night. Home reading is critical to each student's reading progress and is a great way to share individual interests at home.

## WRITING



The teachers in the Yiaga community have been excited to start our Writing unit this term, with a focus on narrative writing. Students have brought in recycled materials from home to create a setting that will be the center of their first piece of writing.

The Yiaga community are focusing on the following topics this term:

- Text type: Narrative
  - Understanding the structure of narrative writing: Orientation, Problem, Series of Events and Solution.
- Using punctuation: capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, question marks and talking marks.
- Grammar: Adjectives, verbs, nouns and tense words
- Spelling; Prefixes, suffixes, plurals and homophones










# NUMERACY X




A big focus for our Numeracy classes in the first few weeks was to look at having a growth mindset when faced with challenging problems. Every Monday students will be exposed to a 'Challenging Question' that will be aimed at stretching the student's way of thinking and intentionally be just too difficult. To be a good learner you have to be comfortable with being wrong and be able to learn from those mistakes, creating a healthy community culture is key to this.

Some of the other topics that will be covered over this term are:

- **Place Value** Identify and describe prime, multiples, factors, composite, square and triangular numbers. Locate and represent these numbers on a number line.
- **Transformation** Investigate combinations of translations, reflections and rotations.
- **Operations** Use written and mental strategies to solve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems.








Cricket Handball Soccer



#### Home Learning Expectations

It is recommended that students in Year 6 participate in a minimum of **30 minutes of home reading per day**. Students are expected to read their take home book on a daily basis (or a Just Right Book agreed upon with their teacher) and return it every day.

Please record the book read each night in their diary. After reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the text with their child to develop a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read. Asking students to make some inferences on the text, to accompany our learning focus for the term would also be very beneficial.




Being a 21st century learning school we have school and home access to some exciting online programs to support the curriculum. In your child's orange home reader book you will find the login details to the following websites:
