# READING

In Reading this term, students are so excited to be back in cross community groups. They have been enjoying Independent Reading where they can practice phonics and comprehension whilst reading their Just Right books. We are continuing to track our thinking about texts in our Readers Notebook.

Students will be working on various comprehension skills, such as:

- **Making Connections:** Students make connections between their own experiences/ prior knowledge and a text or other texts.
- **Inferring:** Students infer character feelings and motivations.
- **Synthesising:** Students talk about what they already know about a topic and new information learnt.
- Summarising: Students explain the most important parts of the story including problem and solution for fiction texts, and the main idea and supporting details for non-fiction texts.
- **Critiquing/ Analysing:** Students explain why they did or did not like the text, and can explain how authors have made the text interesting.

Take Home Reading has commenced again, where students are able to borrow books on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

You might use the take home reading books as an opportunity to listen to your child read, discuss the text and ask them some questions about what they have read.

# WRITING

This term we will be focusing on Persuasive writing. At first we discussed the difference between facts and opinions. We then started critiquing advertisements, in order to identify how they try to persuade us. We also discussed how persuasive texts must have an audience and a purpose.

We have also been writing letters to our pen pals within our community and across the Year 2 cohort. This has been a great way for students to reconnect with old friends and make new friends in preparation for their transition to Grade 3.

In order to nurture our students' love of writing, we have allocated time for 'free writing' on Friday. This encourages students to write about their passions, while practicing purposeful writing.

In our Writing groups we work within their level of need. Here are some examples of these different skills:

- The writing process: Prewriting, Drafting, Revising, Editing, and Publishing.
- Spelling and Jolly Phonics sounds
- Grammar and Punctuation
- Handwriting focusing on letter formation and placement on the lines


