# 5/6 Galada Community Newsletter Term 2, 2018



We are back into the swing of things here in the Galada Learning Community.

We have been busy with our new inter-school sports, commencing our

Economics unit and preparing for NAPLAN. We are really proud of our grade 5 students for their determination during this time. Grade 6s will get their turn next year!



This term we are focusing on:

#### Reading:

- Picking Just Right books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Continuing to build up and sustain Independent Reading stamina
- Identifying unknown vocabulary when reading, and using strategies to find out its meaning.
- Comprehension focus:
  - Summarising both Fiction and Non Fiction texts. The students have been exploring different summarising tools and strategies, including "Somebody, Wanted, But, So Then" for a fiction text. For non fiction texts, students are identifying the main idea, using the GIST strategy or note-taking. The emphasis is on providing a succinct overview of what the text is about, rather than re-telling what happened.



#### Writing:

This Term we are focusing on:

#### Text type - Narrative

- Planning and writing a narrative using narrative text features (e.g. characters, setting, plot, problem and solution)
- Using the seven steps of writing success to assist them with structure.
- Publishing and illustrating a narrative piece to be peer assessed.



#### <u>Grammar</u>

- Conjunctions: Using a word that joins two simple sentences or two phrases together (e.g and, so, but, because)
- Pronouns: a word that replaces a noun (e.g. she, he, we, my)
- Prefix: a word, letter, or number placed before another
- Punctuation: commas, apostrophes, questions marks and talking marks, sentence structures.

### <u>Spelling</u>

- Irregular words
- Jolly/unusual phonics
- Compound words
- Digraphs/quadgraphs
- Irregular spelling words
- Plurals


#### **Numeracy:**

This term we have been encouraging students to go deeper in their thinking to approach mathematical problems. In preparation for NAPLAN, but also to develop mathematical understanding and a range of strategies, students have been working collaboratively to unpack key mathematical language in a question, and interpret pictures that support questions.

We have also been warming up with problem-solving tasks like the one below, and continuing using the Back to Front program for addition, subtraction and place value.



Later this term, students will be working on Probability.



#### **Challenge-based Learning (CBL):**

Our overarching topic is Community- we are focussing on the Economic aspect of this Students have been investigating:

- Concepts such as Supply/Demand and Needs/Wants through various activities
- Various roles within a team (project manager, reporter/promoter, recorder and resource manager) to develop collaboration and communications skills
- Possible solutions to this term's challenge 'What we buy is our choice. Let's take a stand. We have a voice!'
- Further learning through the Commonwealth Smartstart incursion and Caribbean Gardens market excursion (stay tuned) ...

We look forward to sharing student's contributions our community event 'market day' - (more information to come)



#### Grade 5/6 Homework Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Grades 5 and 6 participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of homework per day. Students are to read their take home book on a daily basis and return it **every** day. Please record the book read each night in their diary. **After** reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the text with their child to develop a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.

Being a 21<sup>st</sup> century learning school we have school and home access to some exciting online programs to support the curriculum. Teachers will at times set learning tasks/assessment tasks on these programs for your child to complete.
