Book Week 2018


Find Your Treasure

Dear Parents and School Community,

Welcome back to our school community for another term!

We'd like to share some of our achievements in Design and Digital Technologies during Term 2.

You may be aware that our Years 5 and 6 held a Market Day in the last week of Term 2. Our students were able to work through a thinking process using problem solving and critical skills to launch a business on the day as 'little entrepreneurs'. The students created a number of stalls with clear focus around the economics and design technologies curriculum. The students are now in the process of deciding how the profits will be spent towards improving their educational experience at Harvest Home Primary School.







We also had our Prep communities create a song to inform our local community of our road safety rules. This song was recorded in our recording studio and then played each morning towards the end of Term 2 as part of the Harvest Home Radio Station.

In our Term 3 announcements, a number of Year 3 to 6 students will be involved in an educational project with the Department of Education, Apple and Microsoft Australia to build a game or app.

The project labelled, 'We Can Together', allows students to prototype a game or app to be showcased in an exhibition summit at the end of term. This project will provide an opportunity for our students to deepen their thinking and creative skills, with strong emphasis placed on innovation and student agency. We will continue to keep the school community updated with a selected group's progress and ideas

All Digital Learning clubs, such as, STEAM, Minecraft and Recording/ Film Editing, are continuing to grow in numbers as the year progresses. The clubs have been building students' collaborative and critical think skills with 21st century activities, such as, 3D printing, coding and film editing.

----HHPS Positive Climate Update ----

Welcome Semester 2

As we enter the second half of the year, we are well and truly on our journey with our Positive Climate for Learning. Our students and school community are taking ownership of their actions, celebrating their positive behaviours and learning how to self-regulate when school behaviours become challenges.

As part of data collection in relation to student engagement and behaviour management, we have seen an increase in teacher capacity to manage student interactions, along with a large celebration of student badges and silver/gold trade in's. We have seen a reduction in student behaviour management. This data trend is also reflective in the Outside behaviour data collection, demonstrating that all staff and students are able to effectively manage interactions without additional support and are students are utilising personal skills to play and engage in a friendly and positive manner.





In relation to the Attitudes to School survey, the 4 areas that results have been maintained and/or improved are Classroom Behaviour (86%), High Expectations for Success (96%), Teacher Concern (82% and Student Resilience (84%). In the area of Positive Climate for Learning; our Year 4 data has shown the following: School Connectedness (96%), Sense of Inclusion (94%) and Student Voice (89%).



Evidence in relation to Student Safety result indicate the following overall results (Year 4 – Year 6) – Advocate at School (92%), Managing Bullying (88%) and Respect for Diversity (90%). We are looking forward to unpacking the data from the Parent Opinion survey.

Congratulations to the following students who celebrated 100% attendance during Semester 1. These students have continued to display our school values and ensured they have had personal impact on their learning each and every day. It was lovely to see the students wearing their attendance badges with Pride and enjoying their morning tea with our Principal team.

ONLINE PROGRAMS

As part of the Book Pack, students have access to some wonderful online programs to enhance their learning. The programs are utilised in school and are a part of the HHPS Home Learning Expectations. Logins can be found in the inside of the Home Reading Journal/School Diary.



Wushka is a cloud-based levelled reading program used at school and would love you to continue reading with your child at home. The program encourages students to engage with fiction and non-fiction texts on interactive devices. All School Readers are levelled from Level 1 through to Level 31+ and have been developed using decades of educational publishing experience. Recognising that the best outcomes are achieved when students continue reading at home, your child can use their login details received at school, to complete readers set by their classroom teacher, at home. Your child is using Mathletics as part of their mathematics program at school. Mathletics is a targeted, rewarding and captivating online learning resource, which is aligned to curriculum standards. Your child has take-home access to Mathletics – they simply sign in with their school username and password using any compatible computer or mobile device. The extra Mathletics practice at home can make all the difference to your child's progress. Encourage them to achieve a weekly target of 1000 points to earn a certificate, building through bronze, silver and gold across the school year. Go for gold! www.mathletics.com



Your child is using Spellodrome as part of their literacy program at school. Spellodrome is a literacy resource that provides detailed instruction in spelling and support for vocabulary development. Your child has take-home access to Spellodrome – they simply sign in with their school username and password using any compatible computer or mobile device (same login as Mathletics). The extra Spellodrome practice at home can make all the difference to your child's progress. Encourage them to achieve a weekly target of 1000 points to earn certificates and awards.





ABC Reading Eggs is designed to get your child motivated and excited about reading. Your child will now be able to access the program in class and at home. They will work through the program at their own pace, focusing on phonics, letters, vocabulary, sight words, fluency and comprehension.

Reading Eggspress is designed to build on reading and comprehension skills, and is usually for students in grades 2 onwards (7–13 year olds). There is also a built in library, where once again students can access a wide range of ebooks.
