
3/4 Wurun Community Newsletter Term 1, 2017



It has been a busy start to the year in Wurun Community! To help set up the community and learn how to work collaboratively, the students have been investigating the expected school behaviours of Being Respectful, Being Safe and Being Your Best. In our community students have been earning 'Hero points' for showing these behaviours.

This term we are focusing on:




Reading:

- Picking Just Right books, using the 5 Finger Rule
- Building up stamina during Independent Reading
- Comprehension Strategies:
- Making connections between the text and personal experiences and discussing similarities between other texts they have read
- Making predictions and inferences using clues from the text
- Generating questions about the text before, during and after reading

Writing:

- Powerful writing strategies such as alliteration (e.g. Amazing Anthony ate alligator in Arabia) and onomatopoeia (e.g. Crash! The waves pounded into the rocks and the fisherman was drenched)
- Text types- Descriptions and Narratives
- Handwriting- correct letter formation of 'clock face letters' (a, c, d, f, g, o, q, s)
- Correct spelling and usage of homophones such as there, their and they're



Numeracy

- Addition and subtraction exploring a range of strategies for solving mental and written problems such as doubling, halving, counting on, counting back and make to ten
- Shapes name and describe the features of various 2D and 3D shapes
- Data collect, organise, display and interpret a range of data
- Place Value read, order, model and rename numbers and locate them on a number line

Problem-based Learning (PBL)

- Exploring how we learn best
- Working collaboratively in a range of teams to achieve a common goal
- Setting personal goals related to learning and teamwork and reflecting on these goals





Grade 3/4 Homework Expectations:

It is recommended that students in Grades 3 and 4 participate in a minimum of 20 minutes of homework per day. Students are to read their take home book on a daily basis and return it **every** day. Please record the book read each night in their green home reader log book. **After** reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books and give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.
