READING

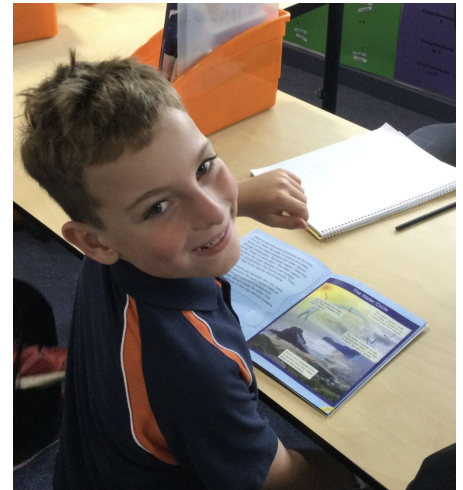
This term we are learning to build our understanding of non-fiction texts. Below are 2 goals we will be working on this term. Additionally, here are some questions that you can ask your child, while reading with them at home:

Goal 1: Readers can understand the information included in the text

- Can you discuss how a text has been organised?
- Can you discuss specific features of a genre?
- Can you identify text features and use them to discuss how they add to your understanding?

Goal 2: Readers understand the importance of the information and themes being provided and make connections to them

- Can you identify parts of a text that add to your enjoyment?
- Can you identify topic specific vocabulary and discuss how it adds to the text?
- Can you use context clues to understand new/topic specific vocabulary?



Supporting Reading at Home:

- Log on to Sunshine Online or Reading Eggs and support your child to read online (passwords can be located in your child's diary).

- Take home reading is well underway, and we're loving celebrating Nights of Reading every week in Dulap. Please support your child by encouraging them to read a book from home and reminding them to log their reading in their school diary.

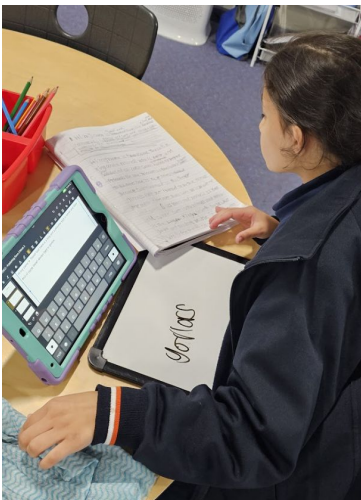
- After reading with your child, discuss the book with them to assist in building their comprehension of the text.



WRITING

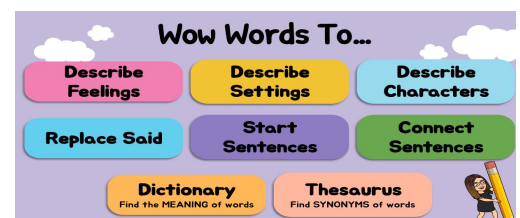
In Dulap, we started our term with Authentic Writing where students explored different writing genres of their choice. We had lots of creative and interesting writing pieces produced!

In term 2, we are focusing on what makes a great persuasive text, including using different persuasive devices such as rhetorical questions and emotive language. We will be exploring creating persuasive texts for different purposes, considering the audience of our writing and the purpose!



Supporting Writing at Home:

- Encourage your child/ren to write a text of their choice using our Writer's toolkit. E.g. What should we eat for dinner? (Persuasive), What I did on the weekend (Recount), How to make a silly sandwich (Procedural.)



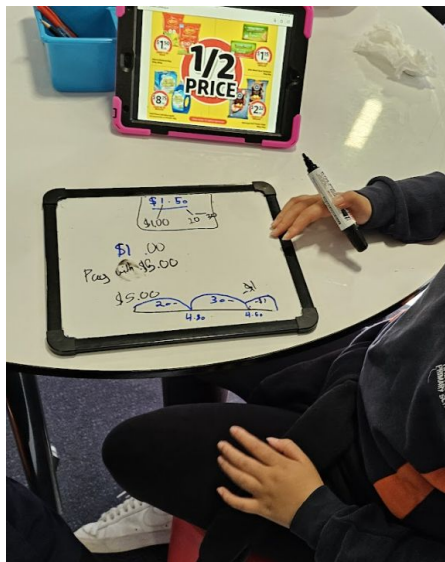
NUMERACY

In our term 2 Numeracy sessions, students have continued to work on their growth mindset and positive attitudes to Numeracy by 'Having a go' and building on their prior knowledge of money.

Students looked at different ways to represent an amount, for example, 20c can be represented with one 20c coin, two 10c coins, or four 5c coins. Students also learnt that 100c is equal to \$1.

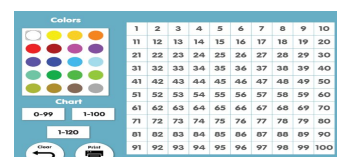
They practiced using the 'Jump' strategy to calculate money equations, such as giving change, and worked together to find the most efficient way to count a large collection of coins.

Later in the term, we will revisit place value, and learn about 3D objects, length and area.



Supporting Numeracy at Home:

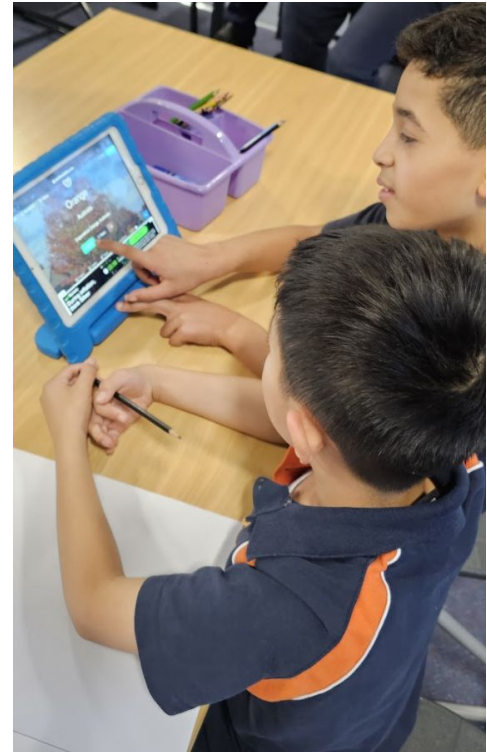
- Students can practise their Counting Goals at home. If you would like any resources to support your child/ren please speak to one of the community teachers.
- Using Mathletics and My Numeracy (Essential Assessment), students can practise and revise topics we cover throughout the year.



INQUIRY - Online Safety

Year 3 students are well underway with our inquiry unit! This term students are exploring Australian geography by investigating different cities, towns and landmarks. Did you know that people live underground in Coober Pedy?

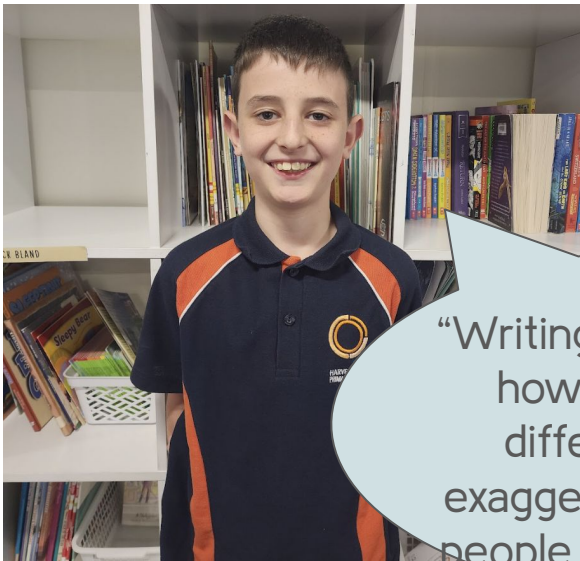

"What have you really enjoyed doing so far this term?"

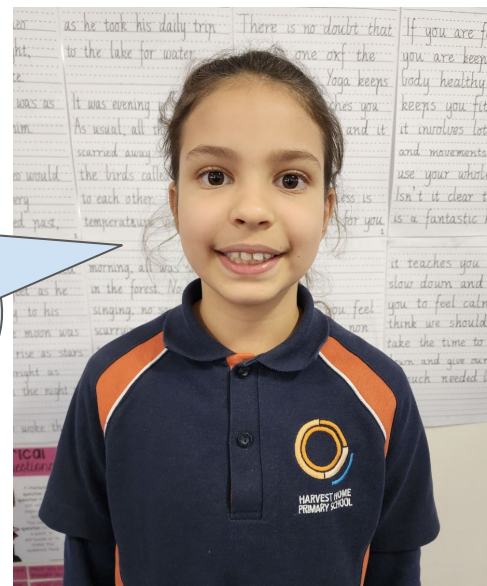


"I've liked being able to write narratives and to pick what we can write about."

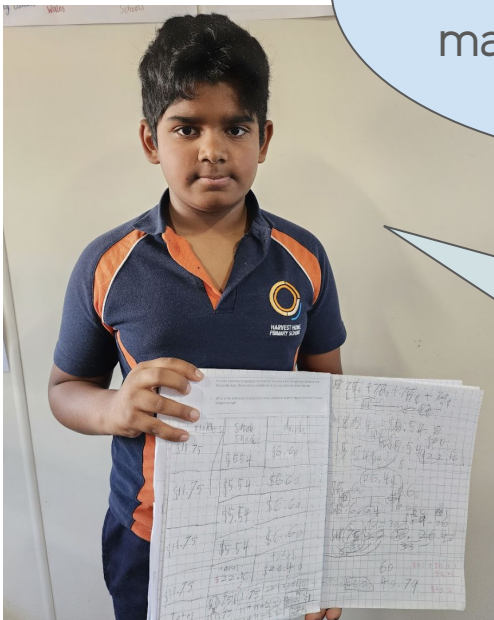


"Writing persuasives, I like how we get to use different things like exaggeration to convince people to agree with us."

HOME LEARNING

It is recommended that students in Year 3 participate in a minimum of 30 minutes of home learning per day. This is something that we are hoping students will work towards as they continue to build their reading stamina at home and at school. **Students are expected to read their take home book on a daily basis, with the opportunity to change it on Mondays and Thursdays using their HHPS Reading Satchel.** On the days when students do not take a book home, they are encouraged to participate in 'Sunshine Online'. This is an opportunity for students to complete their reading on their device. Please record the book read each night in their diary. After reading, families are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the text with their child to develop a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.
