READING

In Term 2 we are continuing on our fiction learning journey. We began the term with a big focus on the author's craft, analysing texts to determine how the author has kept us interested and assisted in our understanding. We also had a look at different genres within fiction, such as fantasy, realistic fiction and sci fi. Next we will begin to build on new vocabulary and understand why authors use different vocabulary for different effects.

Towards the end of the term, we will be engaging in a really exciting 'author study'. We will take a deep dive and look at some of the work by Paul Jennings.







Supporting Reading at Home:

- Log on to Sunshine Online or Reading Eggs and support your child to read online (passwords can be located in your child's diary).
- Students have been asked to begin reading each night at home for 30 mins. Please support your child by reading a book at home with them and logging their reading in their school diary.
- Please record how many nights your child has read by adding up the nights, so we can keep track the total of nights.
- After reading with your child, discuss the book with them to assist in building their comprehension of the text.







WRITING

In Term 2 we are learning to create a Persuasive Discussion.

This style of persuasive writing is different from an exposition, where one opinion is shared. A persuasive discussion involves sharing the opposing sides of an argument. This often includes reasons for and against a topic, or discussing the positive or negative impacts of something.

We will be learning about a mix of effective writing skills and persuasive techniques that can be applied to our writing to engage a specific audience.

NUMERACY

For numeracy in Term 2, so far, we have explored using factors and multiples of numbers to help in understanding the multiplication and division of numbers.

We have also looked at volume and capacity with rectangular prisms and understanding that to find the volume of a rectangular prism, students would need to calculate the length multiplied by the width multiplied by height. We have explored this through converting between units of measurement and adding different quantities of measurement together to find solutions of total volumes.

Starting this week, we have looked at patterns and algebra in understanding equivalent number sentences with multiplication and division.



Later in Term 2 for numeracy, we will be exploring comparing and converting 12 and 24-hour time, connecting three-dimensional shapes with their two-dimensional representations and choosing appropriate units of measurements.

Supporting Numeracy at Home:

- Students can practise their Counting Goals using their Hundred's/Time Table chart in their Home Learning Folder or the interactive chart online.
- Using Mathletics and My Numeracy (Essential Assessment), students can practise and revise topics we cover throughout the year.







INQUIRY

This term in Inquiry we are engaging in the topic 'Civics and Citizenship'. Following the Inquiry model, we have begun in the 'Discover' phase, where we are learning about the three levels of Parliament, the responsibility of parliament members and the voting process. Next we are going to begin unpacking this information further, and begin to plan and create our 'end in mind'. Students will be encouraged to be creative and have some student voice in their learning.









PERSONAL & SOCIAL

This term the Respectful Relationships program commenced in Year 5. Throughout the year we will cover a wide range of topics that teach students how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence.

This week we will finish our learning of Positive Coping, which has included self-talk and different coping strategies used in our daily lives.

For the reminder of the Term we will start exploring ideas around Stress Management.
