






















READING

This term, students will continue working on various aspects of reading, such as

- Developing Independent Reading behaviours including building stamina.
- Using a range of different HHPS Reading
 Strategies, such as stretching the sounds, chunking and onset and rhyme.
- Building a range of reading comprehension skills such as: forming questions, identifying information in the text, making connections to prior knowledge, summarising, identifying new information learnt from the text and identifying the main idea
- Identifying and differentiating non-fiction and fiction text features.
- Identifying new vocabulary in non-fiction texts and talking about what the words mean.







Independent Reading

PHONICS

Each week students have sessions dedicated to Phonics based on their needs.

Within the Phonics sessions students develop their phonological and phonemic awareness. Jolly Phonics is used within the communities to identify the sounds that letters and groups of letters make.

They will build their phonological awareness by developing their understanding of:

- Blending sounds together
- Segmenting sounds apart
- Changing or removing a sound in a word, e.g. change the 'c' in 'cat' to a 'h' to make the word 'hat'





Tricky Words

WRITING

This term we are focusing on writing Information Reports, where students learn to write about an Australian Animal.

The students are becoming authors by brainstorming an animal they have learnt about. They will follow the writing process of planning the structure of their writing piece and drafting and publishing their own mini book.

Within their groups, students will be continuing on the following skills:

- Capital letters for proper nouns and the start of a sentence
- Leaving adequate space between words
- Writing within the correct sections of the dotted thirds
- Rereading our work
- Punctuation
- Recording the sounds they hear in words



NUMERACY

We are going to be looking at a range of Numeracy topics in Term 2. Across all areas of Numeracy, students are encouraged to display a growth mindset by using the '5 Okays of Problem Solving'. Students will engage in learning experiences and challenging tasks that allow them to develop the Numeracy Proficiencies of understanding, fluency, problem solving and reasoning.

Within planned activities, students will be focusing on the following skills:


Time - telling the time to the hour and half hour on analogue and digital clocks.

Location - giving and following directions.

Addition and Subtraction - solving simple addition and subtraction problems using a range of strategies such as count all, count on and count back.

Number Sense - counting patterns and partitioning numbers into smaller parts,


e.g. tens and ones, friends of ten.





Challenge Based Learning (CBL)

HOME LEARNING

In Year 1, Home Learning will consist of Take-Home reading, Tricky OWL word lists for students to practise reading and a number chart for students to practise their counting goal. Each student has a counting goal that they are working towards. Please ensure you are regularly checking your child's progressive reports on Compass to see what their current goals are and how you can best support them at home.

It is recommended that students in Year 1 participate in a minimum of 20 minutes of home learning per day with a family member. Please record the book read each night in their yellow home reader book. After reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books and give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.

This year, each Community will be celebrating home reading milestones on a display showing 25, 50, 75, 100 nights reading and more!
