WELCOME BACK TO TERM 1

Welcome back to Visual Arts, our new room is located in the former Science portable near Dulap. We also have a new Visual Arts teacher Mikaela Ryan is teaching two Year 2 classes on Wednesday afternoons. The room is looking great

and we are already creating inspirational artworks, exploring our identities as a community and self across the year levels. The Senior students are focussing on technical drawing and using their Spanish knowledge! Let's take a look at what is happening in Visual Arts this term...



PREP

The Preps have been working hard already with students learning how to paint with block poster paints, and learning a little about warm and cool colours. We have been working in the community as we get more familiar with school. We drew a sun and used warm coloured paint sticks to colour it, and a cloud which we used cool colours to paint. The students enjoyed using the block poster paints and slick sticks. I am looking forward to introducing them to the Visual Arts room.







YEAR 1/2

The Year 1/2 students are looking at our local environment and animals that live nearby exploring them through a variety of painting mediums. We started off with a mixed media /watercolour artwork, learning how to lay a wash as a base and how to use the right brush for the task in painting.

YEAR 3/4

The Year 3/4 students are exploring identity and expressing who they are in Visual Arts, with inspiration from a range of contemporary First Nations artists who live and work in Victoria. We are looking at how these artists use symbolism, objects and images to talk about who they are, their ancestry and their beliefs. Students explored symbols and designs that represent their identity to create a printing block and we pulled a test print called an Artist's Proof. We created some fantastic designs!







YEAR 5/6

The Year 5/6 students are learning about single point perspective while utilising their knowledge of Spanish. We commenced the term exploring a city in Spain virtually via Google Maps to find a streetscape we want to draw. We are learning about perspective, horizon lines, vanishing points and orthogonal lines.

During Term One, our Prep students explore fundamental motor skills such as Run, Jump, Bounce and Catch in a variety of contexts and with a variety of materials. Students familiarise themselves with expectations in PE and how they can show our school values within the PE setting.



YEAR 1+2



Our Year 1 and 2 students begin the year exploring how we can safely move our bodies in PE. They continue to develop their running, dribbling, throwing, catching and shooting skills through exploration and minor games. Teamwork and cooperation is modelled and encouraged.

YEAR 3+4

In Year 3 and 4, our students participate in a variety of experiences to further develop their throwing, catching, dribbling and shooting skills. They are introduced to sports including European Handball, Netball and AFL to incorporate PE skills with strategy, teamwork and good sportsmanship.



YEAR 5+6



The Year 5 and 6 students recap key fundamental skills involved in sports before building into playing games where they are able to develop teamwork, sportsmanship and strategy. Our Year 6 students participate in Interschool Sports or Home sports to further their sporting opportunities.

Reminders

If you're in Year 2 - Year 6, remember to bring your device to Mindfulness each week!



Our **Prep** learners have been working on building and developing their vocabulary around different feelings and emotions. Students have been working on how they can express how they are feeling. They have been identifying the facial expressions of each emotion through drawing, modelling with playdough and orally. Later this term, they will be exploring what makes them feel happy, sad, angry, scared and excited and what we can do to make ourselves feel better.





YEAR 1+2





Our **Year 1 and 2** program focuses on developing their ability to show an awareness of the feelings and needs of themselves and others. They have begun the term with exploring emotions and expanding their vocabulary for different emotions. Students have used this knowledge to identify the various emotions based on the facial expressions and body language. They have demonstrated this by looking at the similarities and differences of different emotions and through role play.

YEAR 3+4

At the beginning of the term, our **Year 3 and 4** learners expanded their vocabulary on different types of emotions through identifying our body signals when we are feeling different emotions. They then explored different role play scenarios and began to understand how our reactions can impact others. Students will now be exploring these 3 key parts of the brain (PFC, Hippocampus and Amygdala) and their role in regulation.





YEAR 5+6





Our **Year 5 and 6** program focuses on describing ways to express our emotions and the link between emotions and behaviour. Students have been analysing different regulation strategies and how effective they are in getting them back to a 1. Students will begin looking at these 3 key parts of the brain (PFC, Hippocampus and Amygdala) and their role in regulation. Later in the term, students will be combining these two areas and creating a video to inform others on how regulation tools help us and what part of the brain is impacted.

Students in Prep have been learning about everyday technology in the form of hardware and software. In Media, they will explore sounds and images in stories.



YEAR 1+2



Students in Year 1 and 2 have been exploring more advanced ideas in the form of hardware and software. In Media, students will experiment with ideas and develop characters and settings through stories using images, sounds and text.

YEAR 3+4

Our Year 3 and 4 students have been exploring peripheral devices such as keyboards, printers, and microphones - then classing them as input or output devices. In Media, students will create photo stories adding music and voiceovers.



YEAR 5+6



In Years 5 and 6, our students have delved deeper into the components (parts) of a computer, understanding what they are and how they work. In Media, the students will begin exploring conventions with commercials.



Science Newsletter

TERM 1

Welcome back to Science 2024! We have had a great start to the year, check out some of the fun things we have got up to so far!

We began the year conducting experiments, while learning about and demonstrating expectations in Science. Students have had fun making sultanas dance and balloons inflate!





Your 2024 Science Teachers



In Prep, students have been learning about needs and wants, and how living things need food, shelter and water. Students will also explore how living things grow and change through life cycles.







In Year 1 and 2, students are learning about animal classifications and their habitat. Year 1 students will explore features such as fur, feathers, fins and frills. Year 2 students will look into habitats, and how these habitats meet the needs of different animals.

YEAR 3+4

In Year 3 and 4, students are learning about distinguishing between living and non-living things, and how different living things have different life cycles and depend on each other and the environment to survive.



YEAR 5+6



In Year 5 and 6, students will explore a range of adaptations that help living things survive in their environment, and how the growth and survival of living things can also be affected by environmental conditions. This will be done through investigations involving animals and microorganisms.
