READING

This term, we are continuing to read both fiction and non-fiction texts. Students have been continuing to work on various aspects of reading, such as:

- developing a range of comprehension skills, such as inferencing, synthesising, making connections and analysing texts
- summarising skills such as identifying the most important parts of a text
- building independent reading stamina
- identifying different OWL words and phonics sounds in words being read





One focus we have had this term has been identifying facts in non-fiction texts. Kirrip A have had so much fun finding out interesting facts!

WRITING

This term we are focusing on writing procedural texts. Students are also exploring a variety of other text types and engaging in authentic writing experiences. Following our exciting excursion to The Tiny Chef, we will be writing the steps on how to cook a pizza, how to decorate a cupcake or make a milkshake as these were the skills the students focused on at their excursion. Students will be following the writing process of planning, drafting, editing and publishing their work.

Within their groups, students will be continuing to work on the following skills:

- · using consistent boundary punctuation such as capital letters and full stops
- · adding detail to their writing using adjectives and adverbs
- · rereading and editing their work for grammar and spelling
- · using the dotted thirds to help with letter formation



PHONICS

Through Reading and Writing, students will engage in Phonics and Spelling mini-lessons based on the individual needs of the students. Within the Phonics sessions students develop their phonological and phonemic awareness. Jolly Phonics is used within the communities to identify, segment and blend sounds. In Spelling sessions students will practise spelling their Tricky OWL words.

NUMERACY

This term we are continuing to focus on students' problem solving and reasoning skills across a wide range of Numeracy topics.

Across all areas of Numeracy, students are encouraged to display a growth mindset.

Students will continue to participate in numeracy challenges which will encourage them to use a range of problem solving skills.

Within planned activities, students will be focusing on the following skills:

SUBTRACTION

 Revising strategies such as 'counting back' and 'counting up to'

2D SHAPE

Identifying and describing 2D shapes

3D SHAPE

- Identifying and describing 3D shapes

FRACTIONS

 Identifying different representations of one half



DIVISION

- Sharing into equal groups









PERSONAL AND SOCIAL LEARNING

In term 4, students in Years 1 and 2 will continue exploring the Bravehearts program though Personal & Social lessons. The Bravehearts Education Program is a personal safety education program for children ages 5-8. All lessons consider age-appropriate content and language.

Through songs, games and activities, students will be supported to understand what to do if they have a secret and identify trusted people they can talk to.

Later this term, students in Years 1 and 2 will explore Topic 7 of the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships learning resource. The main themes explored in Topic 7 – Gender and Identity are:

Understanding that boys and girls can like or do the same things

Using personal strengths to help in tricky situations

Year One Home Learning

In Year 1, Home Learning will continue to consist of Take Home reading, Tricky OWL word lists for students to practise reading and a number chart for students to practise their counting goal.

It is recommended that students in Year 1 participate in a minimum of 20 minutes of home learning per day with a family member. Students are to read either their take home book or a book on Reading Eggs or Sunshine Online on a daily basis. Please record the book read each night in their yellow home reader book. After reading, parents are encouraged to discuss the meaning of the books and give your child a deeper, richer understanding of what has been read.


