

READING

We started the year off by revisiting what reading learners at HHPS do, including talking about expectations such as how we can do our best independent reading and how to fill out our reading log.

In addition to this, we worked collaboratively to set up and organise our community libraries into different genres as well as choose 'Just Right Books' based on our interests for us to practise our reading stamina with.

We love working in our literacy groups, where we have been focusing on making predictions, summarising and learning about the features of fiction texts, such as character, setting, problem and solution.



WRITING

During writing this term, we have been working on developing students' ideas for writing. We have used different mentor texts to help build up and plan multiple ideas for students to use in their writing.

We have been practising the 'writing process' of brainstorming ideas, writing in detail, editing and publishing our writing. We have enjoyed writing about topics that interest us and have had many opportunities to share all of our fantastic work with our peers.

We have also been learning about how to show pride of place in our writing books. This includes ruling a margin, writing a title and writing the date on every page.

Later in the term, we will focus on writing recounts. During these writing sessions students will participate in different language experiences, e.g. outdoor activities and minute to win it games. Afterwards students will use key vocabulary from the experience, as well as sentence stems to sequence the events and create a recount writing piece.







Things you can do at home:

Allow your child to have a go at writing different types of genres, e.g. shopping lists, letters, party planning lists, narratives, etc.

Encourage your child to write about their experiences which include, who was there, what happened, when did it happen and how they felt.



NUMERACY

All of the students are settled in their Numeracy groups and have had a successful start to the term with their new Numeracy teacher.

During Term I we cover a range of Numeracy topics. We have been revisiting 'The 5 Ok's of Problem Solving' to help us have a growth mindset and learn from any mistakes. During each topic students also participate in open-ended problems and challenging tasks to help improve our problem solving skills and get us curious about different Numeracy concepts

The topics we will be covering in Term I include;

COUNTING

We will practise skip counting forwards & backwards by 2s, 3s, 5s, & 10s and identify missing numbers in a skip counting pattern. Have a look in your Home Learning folder to find your child's counting goal.



We will be making numbers to 100 and then to 1000 in different ways. We will be using ones, tens, hundreds and even thousands blocks! For example - you could make the number 34 with 3 tens and 4 ones, OR you could use 14 ones and 2 tens. Can you think of another way to make the number 34?

LOCATION

We will learn to interpret simple maps of familiar locations, like Harvest Home Primary School. We will be using the following vocabulary: left, right, up, down, in front, behind, forwards, backwards, next to, clockwise and anticlockwise.



2D SHAPE

We will be naming and describing different 2D shapes.
We will be using the vocabulary: squares, rectangles, triangles, kites, rhombus, circles, straight lines, curved lines, edges, and corners.




PERSONAL AND SOCIAL LEARNING










This term, our Personal and Social sessions will be focusing on Being Safe, with a primary focus on how we can be safe when using technology and the internet.
