# Reading

This term in Reading, students have been focusing on reading non-fiction texts. We have been searching for key information and identifying the main idea in these texts. We are also looking at different text features authors include and discussing the purpose of these text features and what information they provide us.

Some non-fiction text features to look out for include:

- maps
- diagrams
- bold words/glossary
- captions
- labels
- photographs
- contents page



# Reading

### What you can do at home:

This term, students will continue to borrow take home books twice a week and will continue borrowing from their community libraries. This book will be changed every 2 to 3 weeks. Please ensure that your child brings their reading satchel to school every day.

We are continuing to celebrate 'Nights of Reading' every week, so please make sure you remind your child/ren to record their home reading in their yellow reading journals, just like we record our independent reading at school.

### Remember that you can record the following:

- take home books
- community borrowing books
- online books from Sunshine Online and Reading Eggs
- books shared on Google Classroom
- personal books

Continue to have discussions about the books you read with your child using the comprehension questions from their take home folder as a guide.

# Writing

This term we are focusing on two genres! We have started the term learning about information reports. We have developed our skills to research a topic, identify important information and paraphrase information we have read. We are learning about non-fiction text features we can include in our writing such as labelled diagrams and headings.

Later this term we will write our own procedural texts. We will include important features such as the materials required and sequenced steps.


Within Literacy groups, students continue to focus on a range of writing skills including:

- · Handwriting (focusing on letter formation, size and placement on the lines)
- · Author's Craft (strategies to make our writing more interesting to the reader)
- · Punctuation, Vocabulary and Sentence Structure


In Spelling lessons, we are learning about trigraphs (3 letters working together to make a sound, for example 'igh' in 'night' making the /ie/ sound) and consonant blends such as 'dr' and 'tr'.

In Grammar lessons we are learning about homophones such as 'there', 'their' and 'they're'. We are also learning to understand the meaning of prefixes and suffixes such as 'mis-' in 'misunderstand' and '-ful' in 'beautiful. We will also learn how to use commas for listing in a sentence!

We are applying what we are learning when we read independently

We are developing writing skills and building our writing stamina!








## **Numeracy**

In Numeracy this term students will cover a range of concepts such as Length, Capacity, Multiplication & Division, Data, and we will be revisiting Place Value and Subtraction. Students will be engaging in a range of problem solving and challenging tasks to apply mathematical thinking and improve their fluency.

### The topics we will be covering in Term 3 include:

### Length/Capacity:

Early in the term we enjoyed using informal measurements, such as our hands or a piece of string, to measure the length of different objects in the classroom. We also had a lot of fun measuring the capacity of different containers. We were then able to use our new knowledge to order objects by length and containers by capacity.

### **Multiplication & Division:**

This term we will be focusing on grouping and sharing. We will be learning about Multiplication & Division at the same time to see how these concepts relate to each other, and the different ways we can represent these kinds of problems. We will be putting our number sentence skills to the test, as well as learning how to draw arrays to match a problem.

Did you know that  $5 \times 4 = 20$  can also be shown as 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 = 20, and that the symbol "x" means "groups of"? You can also flip the number sentence to show division like this:  $20 \div 4 = 5$ !

#### Data:

We are looking forward to our topic of Data where we will be learning all about using tables and picture graphs to represent data we collect. We are already beginning to look at Data by checking the Olympic Medal Tally every day!



# Inquiry

In term 3 Tamboore is very excited to learn about Geography! To begin our Inquiry cycle we are learning about the states and territories of Australia, the continents, and hemispheres of the world. We learned that Australia has 7 states and territories including, Queensland, New South Wales, Canberra, Victoria, Western Australia, Northern Territory, and Tasmania.

This term we are looking at other countries and continents are in relation to Australia; we have been using Google Earth to locate different parts of the world and consider how close or far they are to Australia.

By the end of the inquiry cycle, we will choose an area we want to learn more about and present this in different ways.

# **Personal and Social Learning**

In Term 3 students will focus on help-seeking. This includes identifying different situations where we might need to seek help from an adult and trusted adults we can approach. This term, Years 2 will explore Topic 8 of the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships learning resource.

The main themes explored in Topic 8 – Positive Gender Relations are:


- · What is fair / unfair play? Why do games work well when they are played fairly?
- · Being inclusive and gender friendly boys / girls should not be excluded from particular games due to their gender.
- · What does unsafe behaviour look like?
- · The opposite of unsafe is respectful behaviour. How does it feel when people play respectfully?

This unit is research-based and developed by experts in education and wellbeing, aligned with the Victorian Curriculum. All lessons consider age-appropriate content and language.
