Dear Families,

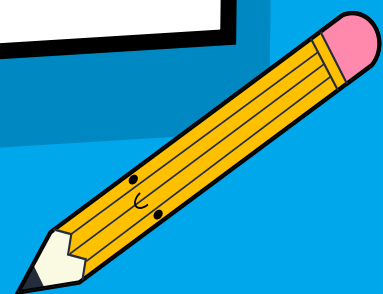

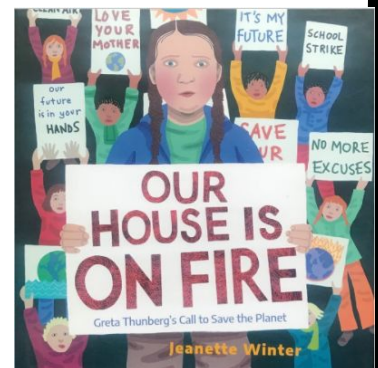
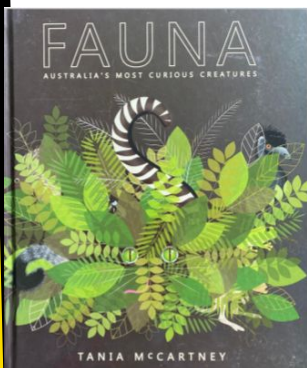

READING

In the first half of the term we are focusing on nonfiction texts. We are exploring a variety of topics and texts types for students to critique and analyse the overarching main idea and purpose of a text.

Students will be given the opportunity to respond to texts in a variety of ways to develop their synthesising, interpreting and summarising skills.



Author Study

Later this term students will be completing an author study on the text "Boy Overboard" by Morris Gleitzman. Throughout this unit students will look deeper into:

- Author's craft and writing techniques that are used to engage readers.
- Connections with different texts by the same author and throughout the text.
- Constructing a detailed book review
- Character traits, motivations and actions.
- Importance of the setting



WRITING

During Term 2 the Year 6 Students will be exploring the text genre of Persuasive, in this unit they will learn about writing a letter to an editor and debating.

Students will be continuing to develop their writing skills by continuing to explore the 6+1 Writing Traits to develop our Ideas, Organisation, Voice and Sentence Fluency.

When choosing a topic, students will consider current world issues, in particular, things we can change to make the world better. They will then think about what action can be taken and the person they must persuade to make such action.

Students will then write and publish a letter to the editor, this letter will include various persuasive devices and evidence to prove their point. Following this, later in the term, they will consider their stance in a debate on their chosen topic.

Students have started Term Two exploring Patterns & Algebra with a focus on Order of Operations. Students have developed their proficiencies of understanding and fluency through a variety of activities.

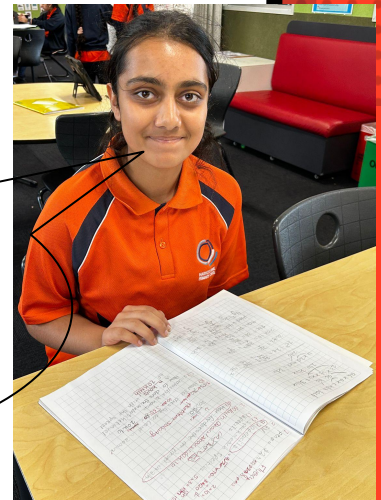
We continue to explore teaching in our new model using a variety of activities from open-ended problems to playing games and unpacking the learning involved.

- Area & Perimeter

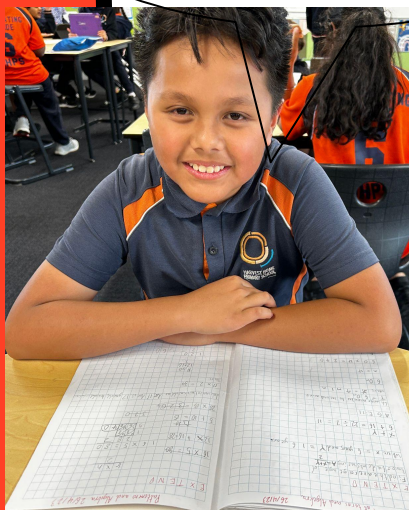
I've enjoyed learning how to solve a problem after creating and using an algebraic expression.

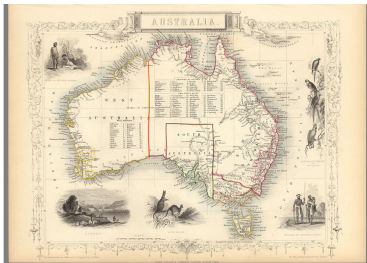
CHALLENGE BASED LEARNING (CBL)

CHALLENGE TOPIC

For CBL this term we are looking at the History of Australia and the different cultures that make up Australia. The following questions will guide our discussion:

- × Who were the people who came to Australia? Why did they come?
