






READING

In Term 3, Year 6 Students will be diving deeper into a range of fiction texts. Students will be able to explore texts that contain deeper themes and make connections between the texts read and their context in real life situations. The Year 6s will also read some current news articles on student friendly platforms such as Kids News to connect with themes such as: change, sustainability and progress.







Connecting with our CBL unit, student will read texts that encourage them to consider how Sustainability impacts them and the world we live in. Students will explore the way fictional characters interact with the challenges faced by global issues and connect to the context of of our community.

WRITING

During Term 3 the Year 6 Students will be exploring the text genre of Information Reports. To correspond with the Term 3 topic of Information Reports, a Media incursion was organised. Students were able to take part in creating a news report, radio advertisement and an animation. Students will be presented with a class video at the end of the incursion.

We will be continuing to develop their writing skills by researching a range of different topics that they can write about. When choosing a topic, students will consider current world issues continuing to make links to our CBL unit on change with a focus on sustainability. To enhance students' technology skills they will publish their work on their own webpage.











NUMERACY

Students have started Term Three continuing their work on angles, area and perimeter to consolidate what they learned at the end of Term Two. Our students will continue this with their Home Learning Module that they will be rewarded with a certificate on completion

We will continue our learning journey and challenge our students with our new model using a variety of activities from open-ended problems to playing games.

CHALLENGE BASED LEARNING (CBL)

CHALLENGE TOPIC

For CBL this term we are exploring the concept of change with a focus on sustainability. The following questions will guide our discussion:

- × What designed solution can I create to make a more sustainable place?
- Yes How can I make a positive change for the future?

Throughout this unit we will be building our understanding of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals as outlined by the United Nations. We will dive deeper into some of the goals to gain a better understanding of what they are, and how they impact us.



Learners will be working towards the end goal of 'making a positive change in the school or community' based on a sustainable topic of their choosing.
