### Visual Arts Newsletter

#### Welcome to the final Visual Arts newsletter for the year!

This term all students will be using a variety of different materials, including paint. We strongly advise providing your child/ren with an art smock for Visual Art sessions. This can be anything that covers their uniform (including their sleeves), such as an old shirt or an art smock.

#### **Art Club**

Every **Tuesday** for the **first half of second break**, there is a Drawing Club available in Nicole's Art space for students in Years 1-3. This club is run by our Visual Arts leaders, so come along, say hello and get arty!

To kick off the term, our Prep students learnt about different types of lines, as well as the colours of the rainbow. Our next project will look at a book response to Edward the Emu, followed by learning how to use watercolour paints by looking at Kandinsky's concentric circles. Finally, we are going to be learning how to use oil pastels with our Picasso self portraits.





# **YEAR 1+2**

Year One and Two students have been busy creating their straw blown creatures by applying puddles of paint and blowing them with a straw. The next activity we will be looking at will be a guided drawing of a giraffe from the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance', and then painting them in with watercolour paints, followed by another book response for 'Koala Lou', where students will be creating a collage piece of a koala. Finally, students will be exploring portrait making and learning about proportions, as well as a brand new printing technique!

### **YEAR 3+4**

Our first project in Years Three and Four was looking at organic shapes by creating their beautiful geodes, even adding some salt crystals to the center! Next, we will be looking at following instructions in a directed drawing of Frida Kahlo, followed by exploring the art elements of colour and pattern with Romero Britto. Finally, we will be looking at artworks by Sandra Silberzweig.



# YEAR 5+6

The Year Five and Sixes have been looking at the technique of One Point Perspective by making their names look three-dimensional. Next we will be looking at symmetry by making our positive and negative insect artwork. We will then be looking at the street artist Thankyoux by making a collaborative art piece. To finish, we will be making some acetate portraits, which will be on display during Year 6 Graduation along with the year 6's One Point Perspective names!

### **YEAR 1+2**

During Term Four, our Prep students will explore participating in different physical activities such as Yoga and how the activity makes them feel.



#### Seesaw

#### Reminders

Our Prep program focuses on developing students awareness of their own strengths in friendships and identifying and describing emotional responses others may experience in different friendship situations. They have begun the term with exploring friendship skills and how they relate to our school values of being Best, Safe and Respectful. Students will continue to deepen their understanding of this through role play, stories and sorts. Later this term, they will be exploring what bullying is and identifying strategies to help them if this occurs.





# **YEAR 1+2**





Our **Year 1 and 2** students have been exploring what bullying means and have been developing an understanding of the different types of bullying that exist: verbal, physical, cyber and social. They have demonstrated this through creating a poster showing different examples of bullying and by connecting their learning to various stories and scenarios. Later in the term, students will be building on this knowledge to identify the impact of bullying and strategies they can use to stop it.

### **YEAR 3+4**

Our Year 3 and 4 program focuses on identifying and analysing the 4 different types of bullying: verbal, social, cyber and physical and the impact this has on people. Students have explored different problem scenarios through text and videos and identified whether the action was bullying and if so the type. Later in the term, students will begin to look at describing and applying strategies to stop or prevent bullying from occurring. They will also be exploring the impact being an Upstander vs Bystander has through the creation and acting out their scripts in Drama.





### YEAR 5+6





At the beginning of the term, our **Year 5 and 6** learners have been learning about the elements of Drama to create engaging characters and moods in a play. They have also used their knowledge on the different types of bullying: verbal, social, cyber and physical. Students will be analysing various scenarios, through media, to identify the type of bullying that was evident and the impact it had on the person being bullied and the bully. Later in the term, students will be exploring the influence their actions have on others health and wellbeing and exploring different strategies and services to support others if bullying is occurring.

#### Your 2024 Science Teachers



In Term 4, our Prep students will be learning about different types of weather and the 4 seasons in the year. Prep students will investigate how we modify our behaviours and dress for different conditions, e.g. wearing a hat and sunscreen when it is sunny.





### **YEAR 1+2**

In Term 4, our Year students will be exploring changes in the weather and how this might affect animals. They will also be looking at the water cycle and how water is an important resource. Year 2 students will investigate the importance of water as one of Earth's resources, and how water can be conserved at school, home and in the garden.

# **YEAR 3+4**

Our Year 3 students will be looking at Sun, Moon and Earth and the relative size between them, and exploring how Earth's rotation on an axis causes regular changes. Year 4 students will be looking into how natural processes and human activity can affect Earth's surface.





### YEAR 5+6

In Term 4, Year 5 students will be investigating major geological events and extreme weather conditions and how these can affect Earth's surface. Year 6 students will be learning about how Earth is part of a system of planets orbiting around the Sun. They will also be modelling relative size and distance between Earth, other planets in the solar system and the Sun.

# PREP AND YEAR 1

In Term Four, Prep students will be exploring key parts of media art pieces such as characters and settings, and comparing how different artists and cultures illustrate these features. Prep students will also explore various media arts careers such as photography, directing, and animators

Year 1 students will investigate what media arts is and the places they might see examples of media art in their community. Students will discuss how media art can be made for a range of audiences and purposes.






# YEAR 2/3

In Year 2 and 3, students will be exploring what documentaries are and creating their own. Year 2 students will be using Google Slides and voice recording to create a documentary on Harvest Home PS. Year 3 students will be filming themselves discussing how their culture differs from other cultures.

# YEAR 4/5

Year 4 and 5 students will be exploring media arts elements such as camera angles, music, and lighting to create their own media film piece. Year 4's will be creating a short film about a conflict. Year 5's will be creating an advert using a specific genre, for example horror or comedy. Both year levels will investigate how changing various elements can create suspense and alter how a viewer feels.





### YEAR 6

In Term 4, Year 6 students will be creating their own news show, building their media art skills on directing, editing and cinematography. Later in the term, students will use the scratch app to create their own game.
