#### Reading

This Term, students will be focusing on reading fiction texts. They will be working towards understanding and remembering the events in texts, as well as discussing and articulating key concepts such as: character development, inferencing and big ideas. They will develop these skill skills through building their reading stamina and sharing their ideas within small groups.

In the community we will begin to celebrate students' nights of reading and remind families to help their children to record this in their student diaries. Students can utilise Take Home books and have access to online subscriptions such as; Reading Eggs and Sunshine Online. Community library borrowing will start up again early Term 2 so stay tuned!

We look forward to growing a love of reading together!

















#### Writing

To begin the year, students have been working on authentic writing tasks. Students have showcased their wonderful writing skills across a range of genres such as narratives, persuasive texts and recount.

Moving forward, our Year 4 students will have the opportunity to explore narrative writing, from planning and drafting, to revising, editing and publishing their narratives. Throughout this process students will be exposed to different techniques and will use many mentor texts to engage their readers, employing ambitious vocabulary, descriptive language and elements of suspense to create compelling stories.

















#### Numeracy

This term in Numeracy, students will explore a range of topics through problem solving tasks, explicit teaching, games and puzzles, as well as reasoning activities. They will be required to show their thinking and explain their answers in all areas to demonstrate their understanding.

Students will be exploring the following Numeracy topics throughout Term 1:

- Counting patterns, including patterns counting by 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9
- 2D and 3D shape, including comparing the features of 2D shapes and 3D objects, as well as combining and splitting shapes
- Place value, including recognising, representing and ordering numbers to at least tens of thousands
- > Equivalent number sentences using addition and subtraction
- > Symmetry, including creating symmetrical pictures and finding symmetry in the environment.

We look forward to seeing all the wonderful achievements in Numeracy this term!











### Inquiry / Online Safety

During Term 1 students will participate in weekly lessons where they will be exploring how to be safe online at home and at school. They will learn how to communicate respectfully on different online platforms and explore safe choices when using technology. During these activities students will complete tasks that involve them practising these skills through role plays, group work and individual tasks, where they will be able to collaborate to share ideas and learn alongside each other.



### Take Home Learning

All students have been provided with weekly opportunities to bring home a take-home reader through the school's 'Show and Swap' process. Students are expected to engage in daily reading sessions for the recommended duration of 30 minutes. Actively listening to your child read aloud is not only valuable for families but also aids in the continuous celebration of their reading progress. Upon completion of each book, it is imperative to record the reading session in your child's student diary. Kindly note that all students at HHPS are required to have a reading satchel to borrow a book.

Students will gain access to the 'At Home Learning Module' during week 6, via their Google Classroom. This module focuses on the topic of 'Symmetry' and will involve creating symmetrical patterns, pictures, and shapes with and without digital technologies. Designed with students' needs in mind, these modules are easily accessible and self-paced, allowing students and their families to collaborate on the tasks at a convenient time.

In the area of Numeracy, your child is presently working towards achieving a goal. We kindly request that your child dedicates a minute or so each night to practicing this goal.
