What a wonderful start we have had to Term 1. Our students have settled in well into their new Year 5 building in Matong. Matong means 'Strong', and we can't wait to build our strong minds and our resilience. The students have been busy getting to know their new community teachers and each other. We look forward to continuing working with you this year to help our learners soar to new and exciting heights.











## READING

This term we have been working on two key goals when reading Fiction Texts. Firstly, we are learning to summarise the significant events in the text. Secondly, readers understand the importance of setting and know a character deeply through inferring the characters traits.

- We are learning to describe how events, characters and settings in texts are depicted and explain their own responses to them.
- We are learning how to use evidence from the text such as revealed through thought, dialogue, behaviour to infer character traits.
- We are learning to make predictions about the characters by thinking about their actions and events in the text. Then we will make reasonable predictions about what a character is likely to do next with supported evidence from the text.






### Supporting Reading at Home:

- Please record how many nights your child has read by adding up the nights, so we can keep track the total of nights.
- After reading with your child, discuss the book with them to assist in building their comprehension of the text.









## WRITING

#### NARRATIVE WRITING

Exciting news from our Year 5 classroom! We've embarked on a thrilling journey into the world of narrative writing, and the creativity is flowing. We will be focusing on the following points to develop our narratives:

- Building a problem using descriptive language and the Pebble, Rock, Boulder strategy.
- Exploring a range of sentence types.such as simple, compound and complex sentences but also different ways of using these to add impact to our stories such as the "Explore the Subject" sentence.
- Using character traits to develop our characters.

#### EXPLORE THE SUBJECT

Start with the subject and then add an interesting fact before carrying on with the sentence. Separate the added part by using commas.

Miss Jack, usually a tidy and organised individual, left the house in a mess all that week.



#### PERSUASIVE WRITING

We will also look into persuasive writing techniques. Students will be exploring different persuasive structures such as developing a strong argument, using target audience to persuade, exploring the use of high modality verbs, and using evidence to support their topic.







## NUMERACY

Students have been excited to work in their Numeracy groups so far this Term.

This year we are using the LED model in Numeracy where we start a session by **Launching** a problem for the students and letting them **Explore** to try and solve the problem. We then come together to **Discuss**, the teacher will facilitate the sharing of strategies and how to solve the problem.


This term we have learnt about Place Value which involves recognising, naming, ordering and rounding numbers. We will also be working on Multiplication and Division where students will use a range of mental and written strategies to solve problems.

Other topics we will be learning include measurement and geometry – perimeter & area. Keep an eye out for the maths modules on Google Classroom!









# PERSONAL & SOCIAL LEARNING

Our Personal and Social Learning in Matong is centered around our expected learning dispositions within our community and during our learning. Our students are familiar with these dispositions, and we are currently discussing how to utilise them to aid our learning. We have been engaging in collaborative activities to demonstrate the utilisation of different roles in achieving a common goal during collaboration.

During Term 1, we focused on discussing our online behaviors. Recently, we had a session with the team from Inform and Empower. Navigating the complexities of the online world can be challenging, but by comprehending how to stay safe online, we can harness the digital world to support our learning and understand what steps to take if something goes wrong. But also using our "how are we feeling" scale we can identify when we might need to dip into our tool box for a strategy to allow us to focus on the problem rationally.

In Year 5, we completed our first inform & empower Digital Safety & Welling live stream incursion – Thrive Online


